


The Sparkboard

The Sustainable Finance Hack

Since 2019, Open Geneva has organised its annual hackathon on Sustainable Finance, on the sideline of the Building Bridges week, with the support of Geneva's leading financial institutions, the University of Geneva and the United Nations Institute for Training and Research.

This 24-hour hackathon aims to find concrete solutions to real-world problems faced by the finance sector. The hackathon unites multidisciplinary teams to tackle challenges presented by hackathons partners such as financial companies, start-ups, international organizations and academics.

This year marks the 6th edition of the hackathon, taking place on October 11th-12th in the SDG Solution Space in Geneva.















As a partner, your involvement and impact will be showcased through University of Geneva and Open Geneva's workshop and communication efforts at the event.


