
WE OFFER A DIGITAL PLATFORM TAILORED FOR HACKATHONS The Sparkboard

24H TO BECOME A CHANGE-MAKER IN SUSTAINABLE FINANCE The Sustainable Finance Hack

Since 2019, Open Geneva has organised its annual hackathon on Sustainable Finance, on the sideline of the Building Bridges week, with the support of Geneva's leading financial institutions, the University of Geneva and the United Nations Institute for Training and Research.

This 24-hour hackathon aims to find concrete solutions to realworld problems faced by the finance sector. The hackathon unites multidisciplinary teams to tackle challenges presented by hackathons partners such as financial companies, start-ups, international organizations and academics.

This year marks the 6th edition of the hackathon, taking place on October 11th-12th in the SDG Solution Space in Geneva.







COLLABORATION WITH BUILDING BRIDGES to expand the hackathon's impact

Building Bridges is a joint initiative by Swiss public authorities, finance institutions, the United Nations, NGOs, and international partners, that aims to advance sustainable finance in Switzerland and around the globe.

Building Bridges was the catalyst for the creation of the Sustainable Finance Hack in 2019. The idea was to hold a hackathon prior to their annual international event in December, where insights and solutions from the hackathon's collective intelligence efforts could be shared.

Today, the Sustainable Finance Hack stands as Geneva's premier annual hackathon in sustainable finance, collaborating with Building Bridges to cultivate partnerships within their community.




